MO Department of Public Safety, First Responder Equipment Grant Proposal – The Board discussed the proposed equipment that would be purchased with the grant funds. The Chief pointed put that the cost on the list supplied to the board double counted the docking systems for the police cars as that cost was included in the \$24,500 cost for the six Toughbooks. He discussed that they could use 12 Toughbooks but are currently waiting to see if another grant applied for (asking for 6 Toughbooks) comes through. They also discussed the cost and interoperability of the Public Works radios in the proposal. Lt. Sutton will look into the compatibility and type of radios needed for public works to communicate with the WCPD. Alderman Hakim made a motion to postpone the discussion until the December 28 meeting. Alderman Arbuthnot seconded it, and the voice vote was as follows:

## **Ordinance/Resolutions**

Bill 19-23 – AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 365.070 AND ADOPTING SCHEDULE X OF III OF THE WRIGHT CITY MUNICIPAL CODE PERTAINING TO STREETS WHERE COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC IS PROHIBITED. The Bill was read for the first time The Board discussed the need for and fairness of a law that would change builder access after the City approved the development. The Mayor cautioned that the City is growing, and the Board will have to be progressive to protect its infrastructure. The Board discussed not supporting the Bill.

There was no call for a second reading. Bill No. 19-23 died for lack of a second reading.

#### **Reports**

**Parks** – The Christmas Parade was a success with over 40 floats and vehicles in the parade which does not include the walking group. Estimated 350 to 400 people came to the park after the parade. The Mayor stated she thought Renee did a great job on the Parade. 193 for Breakfast with Santa.

**Police** – Chief thanked everyone for the success of Shop with a Cop. Visit to Holy Rosary School. Highway patrol looking for overweight vehicles.

**Treasurer** – Ms. Hutchings is finalizing the budget and working on 6-month financials.
